



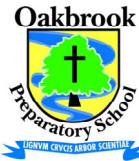

Last week as I stood at the back of the gym observing the performances for the Winter Arts Program, I was overwhelmed by the talent of our students and teachers, but I was also caught up by the message that was being conveyed. I don't think that I have ever seen a high school performance that matched this one.

Many of the parents who have been around the school for a number of years came up to me after the evening to tell me how amazed they were. Several pointed out that the fifth grade band students were tremendously accomplished after only one semester in the band program. Others noted the quality of the performance by the older students and were praising Mrs. Atherton for the excellence they had witnessed. Many were still wiping the tears from their eyes from the immensely moving finale that Mrs. Howard's dance students had performed.

Mrs. Biggar and Mrs. Garrison had opened the evening with a spectacular art exhibit. Many of these pieces showed mastery far beyond the years of the individual artists. Then the band and dance programs followed.

In considering the event, I believe that it spoke volumes about Oakbrook. It is difficult sometimes for people who hear a description of our school to truly understand its uniqueness. What I saw resonated with the Charlotte Mason approach to education. The idea of lifting up students to develop their personal gifts, of encouraging cultural awareness, of offering a Christ-centered foundation: these are flourishing at this school.

Too often at Christmas we get caught up in Santa Claus and the hustle and bustle of shopping and gift giving. We will take a little time to remember the birth of Jesus, but we don't concentrate nearly enough on the gift of Christ, the life of love and sacrifice that has brought the opportunity for salvation and light to a sinful and dark world. The finale of the program presented this great message. I felt amazed and blessed to receive this remarkable Christmas gift.
