Study after study has shown that the best way to acquire vocabulary, improve reading comprehension, and to enhance writing skills is through wide-reading. Not only does reading provide students a chance to engage in interesting narrative, but it also provides the opportunity to develop language skills. Consider the following:

To read complex texts, students need a knowledge base that is both broad and deep. Much of this knowledge base is built through reading itself. Upon completion of the book, write a review. This is a graded assignment and is due the first full day of school in August. Reviews will be made available throughout the year in the classroom to assist students in book selections.

Reading Requirement for the 2018-2019 School Year:

It is my hope that you read many other books this summer and throughout the year. **Seventh grade students are required to read 15 books for English class.** A copy of the genre requirements and a reading log is provided. The books you read this summer may count toward this requirement so be sure to log in all the books you read. I will do the same.
